

Personal Social, Emotional Development

Think and talk about the perspectives of others. Show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge.

Recap on school rules and boundaries, understanding how and why rules keep us safe. Continue to develop an emotional vocabulary, learning how to identify and develop strategies for self regulation.

Ways to stay safe in familiar and unfamiliar environments.

Communication and Language

Ask and answer a range of questions including who, what, when, where and how. Take part in the class show and tell time. Explain how a superhero gadget works and give reasons for why things happen. Listen to and talk about non-fiction texts understanding the difference between fact and fiction.

Physical Development

Continue to work on correct letter formation and beginning to write on a line. Learn to safely use a hammer, hand drill and screwdriver. Learn and develop a range of ball skills including throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting and aiming. Sports day practice. Create a simple superhero dance with repeating moves in time to music. Learn how to tie some basic knots. Get dressed and undressed independently.

Superheroes fact or fiction?



Literacy/Phonics

Say and write 4 to 6 word sentences with finger spaces using some adjectives.

Learn the letter names in the alphabet. Put capital letters at the beginning of sentences and full stops at the end.

Write/tell their own superhero story using some story language.

Compare fact and fiction texts. Learn the digraphs, **ur**, **ow**, **oi**, **ear**, **air**, **ure** and **er**.

Recognise and read the tricky words, **some**, **there**, **out**, **little**, **what**, **come**, **do**, **so** and **were**.

Understanding the World

Learn about how real life superheroes help us; emergency workers, scientists, parents, environmentalists and cleaners. Discover how firefighters' uniform and equipment has changed over time.

Investigate rainbows, the power of magnets, how light and sound travel and what makes ice melt. Finding out about special places of worship for different religions.

Expressive Art and Design

Developing their own superhero storylines in pretend play. Listen attentively, move to and talk about music expressing their own feelings and responses.

Work collaboratively, creating a sequence of superhero dance moves to perform for an audience. Design and make a superhero outfit and gadgets. Learn how to draw figures in action, weaving and clay work

Maths

Building numbers beyond 10. Matching pictorial representations with matching numerals to 20. Counting patterns beyond 10. Understanding 2 digit numbers eg. 14 is one full ten and four ones. Estimating larger quantities and checking amounts using 10 frames. Comparing and ordering by volume. Recreating patterns, investigating how shapes can be built using smaller shapes and tangrams. Adding and taking away numbers using the 'First, then and now structure'.
